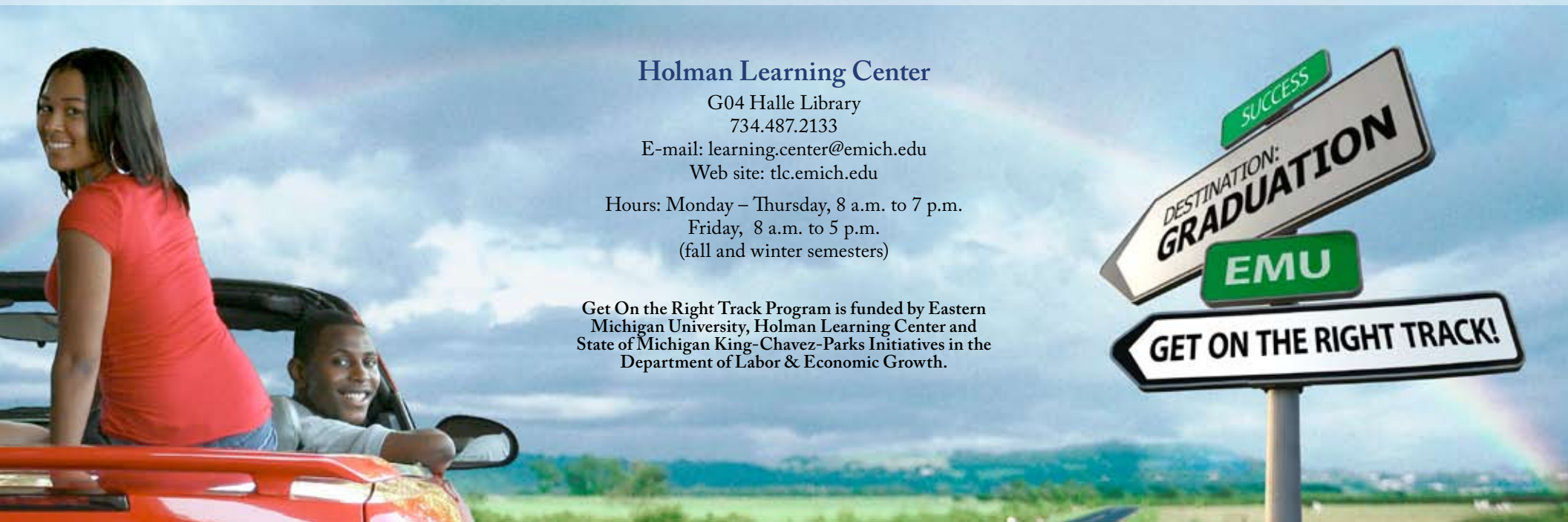
Your first year of college is critical.

Freshmen who finish their first semester in good academic standing are much more likely to continue in college, and eventually to graduate.

If you do finish college, your future will be on the right track! As of 2007, 95% of EMU graduates who earned bachelor’s degrees had jobs in their fields. And, 98% of EMU graduates with master’s or doctoral degrees had jobs in their fields.
